We're delighted you are considering managing your/your child's myopia with MiSight® 1 day contact lenses. Fitting contact lenses is usually a simple and straightforward process which can take place over several appointments. Don't worry – we'll give you all the time you need. Myopia management is a fast-developing area of research and requires commitment from both of us and this is outlined below:

We aim to keep up to date on myopia management research to make sure you/your child receives the very best advice.		I understand that MiSight® 1 day contact lenses will help me/my child see clearly and they may help to slow down the speed of my/my child's myopia progression.		
MiSight® 1 day has been shown to slow down the speed at which myopia typically progresses by about half (59%)*. We will monitor and track your/your child's progress.		I understand that individual results do vary and that the final prescription outcome cannot be guaranteed.		
We have recommended an appropriate wearing schedule to benefit from the potential reductions in myopia progression with MiSight® 1 day lenses while ensuring your/your child's eyes remain healthy.		I understand the importance of following the recommended wearing schedule (10 or more hours per day, 6 or more days per week).		
We have recommended the most appropriate appointment schedule to ensure your/your child's eyes remain healthy.		I agree to attend regular appointments to make sure that my/my child's eyes are assessed regularly and progress is monitored closely.		
We will continually reinforce advice on wearing and caring for your/your child's contact lenses to minimise the risks to your/your child's eye health and vision.		I understand that there are risks associated with wearing contact lenses and these risks can be minimised by following the advice given by my eye care professional.		
We will always reinforce the most up-to-date advice regarding contact lenses and water. Water from taps, showers, swimming pools and other water-based activities increases the risks of serious eye infections that could lead to permanent loss of vision. Contact lenses should never be worn where they could become contaminated with water of any kind.		I understand that contact lenses should never come into contact with any water, including water from taps and showers, and all water-based activities including swimming, as this could lead to a serious infection and loss of vision.		
We will provide you/your child with information on what constitutes an eye emergency and what to do should an emergency occur.		I understand what steps to take should my/my child's eye become red, or painful, or if my/my child's vision becomes blurry.		
We have given you appropriate instruction on how to handle your/your child's contact lenses and on the appropriate hygiene regime required.		I feel comfortable with handling and caring for my/my child's contact lenses and will contact Specs of Kensington should I feel I need further instruction on this.
